Barkandi – (Indian Curry House)

Currently holds a **Retail License**. Could qualify for a restaurant or bar & grill license but would lose the ability to sell packages to take back to their room.

Catering permits in 2025: 0.

Questions for Council to consider asking:

1. A ***Bar & Grill License*** allows sales of alcoholic liquor and malt beverages for on premise consumption. Establishment must have a restaurant to qualify. Alcohol sales cannot exceed 40% of gross sales. A ***Restaurant License*** allows service of alcoholic liquor and malt beverages to patrons in dining areas of restaurants. Alcohol sales cannot exceed 40% of gross sales.
2. Have you sold more than 25 packaged liquors in the last 6 months?
3. Have you sold more than 50 packaged liquors in the last 12 months?
4. How many Catering Permits has your business obtained in the last 12 months?

H4U Inc – (Plains Trading Post)

Currently holds a **Retail License**. Could qualify for a restaurant license but would lose the ability to sell packages to patrons to take them back to their rooms.

Catering permits in 2025: 0.

Questions for Council to consider asking:

1. A ***Bar & Grill License*** allows sales of alcoholic liquor and malt beverages for on premise consumption. Establishment must have a restaurant to qualify. Alcohol sales cannot exceed 40% of gross sales. A ***Restaurant License*** allows service of alcoholic liquor and malt beverages to patrons in dining areas of restaurants. Alcohol sales cannot exceed 40% of gross sales.
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Pinz LLC – House of Pinz (Bowling Alley)

Currently holds a **Retail License**. Could qualify for a bar & grill, as long as 60% food and entertainment sales, and 40% alcohol.

2. A ***Bar & Grill License*** allows sales of alcoholic liquor and malt beverages for on premise consumption. Establishment must have a restaurant to qualify. Alcohol sales cannot exceed 40% of gross sales.

TKB Club – Douglas Community Club (Golf Course)

Currently holds a **Retail License**. Could qualify for Limited Club. Can offer one-day membership. Would lose ability to obtain catering permit.

Catering permits in 2025: 1.

1. A **Limited Club License** allows clubs such as veterans, fraternal organizations, golf or social clubs to sell alcoholic liquor and malt beverages for on premise consumption to members and their accompanied guests. Package sales is prohibited.

3. Have you sold more than 50 packaged liquors in the last 12 months?
